



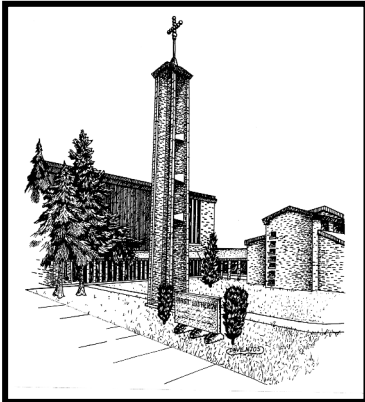

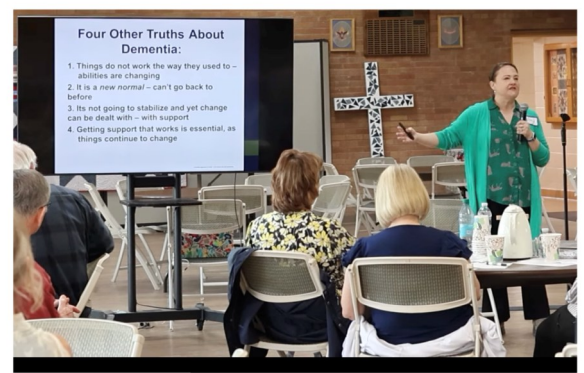

FAITH STATEMENTS OF 2026 CONFIRMANDS



During their preparation for Confirmation, students are invited to create a cross that reflects their personal faith journey. Along with this cross, each student writes a faith statement expressing what their relationship with God means to them. The following are the faith statements of the 2026 First Lutheran Confirmands.

Jamison Didier

Hi, my name is Jamison Didier and my cross is about my family and friends. The first thing I want to talk about is the cross itself. My cross symbolizes my love for God and how he has helped me through my tough times in life. I made this cross and it means a lot to me. When I look at it, I don't just see wood. I see important parts of my life. Right in the middle there is a small pocket cross. It reminds me of

my faith and how I try to do the right thing, even when things are hard. It's small, but it feels important because it's something I can carry with me wherever I go. Hanging on the cross are my first wrestling shoes. Those shoes remind me of when I first started wrestling. I remember being nervous but also excited (I even cried). I had to learn a lot, like how to stay strong and not give up. Even when I lost matches, I kept trying. Those shoes show how I grew and worked hard. There are also shotgun shells on the cross that remind me of time spent outdoors and moments with people I care about. They stand for lessons I've learned about responsibility and respect. Putting all these things on one cross makes it special to me. It shows my faith, my hard work in wrestling, and important memories from my life. Every time I see it, it reminds me of who I am and what matters most to me.

Jaxson Didier

This cross is very special to me because it shows different parts of my life and how they connect to God. The cross itself reminds me of Jesus and how He died for us because He loves us so much. It stands tall and strong; kind of like faith is supposed to be. The small pocket cross on it shows that God is not just in big things, but He is also with us in small ways every day. You can carry Him with you wherever you go. The wrestling shoes on the cross are important too. They show hard work, practice, and never giving up. Wrestling can be tough, but having faith in God has helped me stay strong and keep going even when things are hard. It reminds me that God gives us strength in our struggles. The shotgun shells represent protection and responsibility. They remind me to make good choices and stay on the right path with God guiding me. The dirt bike goggles show fun and adventure. They remind me that life is not just about work, but also about enjoying what God has given us. Altogether, this cross shows that God is part of everyday life, sports, hobbies, challenges, and even small everyday moments. It reminds me that no matter what we do, God is always with us.

Brandon Staloch

This is my cross. Everything on this cross is to represent things that relate to me and my faith. The things on this cross are very special to me and help throughout my life. Shotgun shells (or hunting in general) are displayed on this cross because of preparedness and purposeful living. Preparedness: because it makes me ready for anything that can happen, even though I don't know what or when. Purposeful living: while hunting I always think about how God provided animals as food for us. Golf tees are on the cross because I like to go golfing with my grandpa. My family and I enjoy mini golfing too. It brings me closer to my family, and I enjoy being able to spend time with them. I have a fishing lure on my cross because I love being outdoors and in nature. This brings me closer to God's creation with this world that he made so pretty for us to enjoy. I have a little toy tractor on my cross because ever since I was little, I've always enjoyed every aspect of farming. Its faith to me is when I help family and friends with farming, I feel good that all these crops are going to be feeding animals and people. This is what God intended. I love sunset pictures. When I watch the sun go down, I think about how God made the sky so pretty, every single night. This represents to me that, "It's another day down, and tomorrow is another day. Something good will happen." And it always does. I have a 4-H clover pin. The four H's stand for Head, Heart, Hands and Health. I have grown closer to the community and made friends with other 4-H members around the state, 4-H reminds me to make my best better. I have a taekwondo pin on the cross because my grandma enrolled me into this sport when I was 7 years old. She really enjoys watching me at taekwondo tournaments. The Golden Rule in taekwondo, which is do unto others as you would have done unto you, brings God into my spirit and gives me strength. (Matthew 7:12) The cross itself is made of firewood because I like campfires, and it reminds me of camping with my family and friends. This brings me closer to the ones that I love.

I was in welding class when we were assigned this project to build a cross. I thought, well it can't be that hard to weld a cross, so I had my welding teacher help me with the dimensions and I welded it together. I made varsity hockey this year and ended up getting injured right away with a knee injury and I had to sit down and ask God for guidance to help me get through this to get better and be able to play again. I am very fortunate to have all four of my grandparents still around. Through the years, they have told me stories of how God has helped them in their lives and have guided me on what they do for the church and helped me have a better understanding of God. With hunting, God provides the animals and nature so I can provide food for my family. It also teaches me to respect the land and animals. Lastly, farming is a large part of my life. With farming, we have to keep our faith and trust God because there are so many things we are unable to control like the weather, prices and disease.

On each end of my cross are my football cleats. Football is the biggest part of my life, and I've fallen in love with it the older I've got. Football can be a very aggressive sport, but it is also very demanding from watching hours of film, cramps, and bruises. Every day, I have the power to get up from bed whether I am bruised, banged up, or just tired; he gives me the strength to keep going. The last thing on my cross is pictures of my family and friends. Giving me the opportunity to meet these people has been a blessing itself. Every day they help me grow, learn, and have fun. My family shows a lot of support with my sports as well. 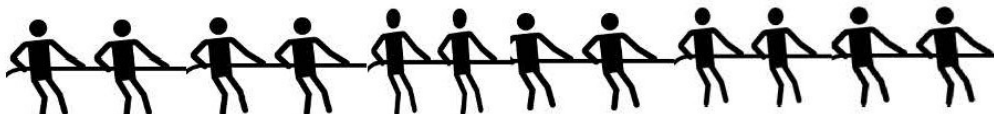

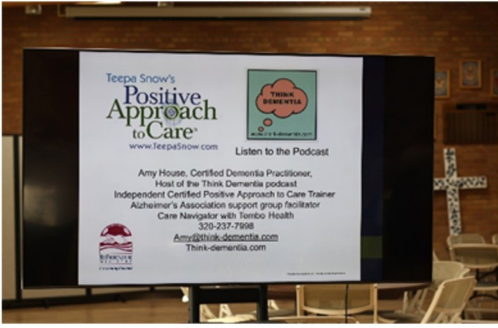

FIRST LUTHERAN CHURCH COUNCIL MINUTES

May 12 , 2026

The meeting was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by Pres. Travis Feiring. Prayer was shared by all.

Roll Call: Travis Feiring, Jean Lindvig, Beverly Conway, Kathleen Sinclair, Phyllis Stokke, Pauline Everson, Steve Rehak, Steve Slocum, Baylee Hanson, Deacon Lynea Geinert, and Pastor Stephen Hilding.

Devotions: Pastor Stephen requested we share our favorite Bible verses, and continue to over the summer month meetings.

Minutes April 14, 2026 minutes were reviewed. Motion made by Steve Slocum, 2nd by Pauline Everson to accept the amended minutes as submitted. Motion passed. Kathy will take minutes for June council meeting. Consent Agenda Added 12.c confirmands Motion by Steve Slocum and 2nd by Pauline Everson to accept the agenda as amended.

Pastor Report – Attached. Pastor Stephen Shared events of the past month, to include 3 baptisms, 6 affirmations of baptism and faith. Upcoming events are blessing of 47 Lutheran World Relief quilts and 10 others shared in the area, Muffins with Mom, Senior Brunch, Pastor Installation and reception, synod assembly, and he offered some vacation dates. A membership update report was also shared.

Deacon Report – Attached. Lynea shared her evaluations of the Listening with Heart event. It was deemed a success.

Staff Reports – Pastor Stephen and Personnel Committee submitted a proposal for expansion of summer hours up to 30-hours-per-week for Zach Myhrer with a review in August or September for future hours. The summer expansion will enable him to focus on website and all media progress, collaborating with Sam Maggard and Media/Tech committee, to be prepared to launch in September. Motion by Steve Slocum to approve a temporary increase in hours for June through August, with a review at the end of the summer to evaluate effectiveness and determine next steps. Kathy Sinclair seconded the motion, and all were in favor. Motion passed. Pastor Stephen shared his goals for weekly meetings and quarterly meetings for staff, for the full- and part-time staff.

Financial Report – Beverly pointed out in our monthly report liabilities and worship offering. General Fund balance is \$19,845.55. April offerings were 53,580.69. We are at 30% of our budgeted income. Attendance numbers are increasing each Sunday. Motion by Steve Slocum and 2nd by Baylee Hanson to accept the financial report. Motion passed.

Committee reports –

Personnel Committee. Met and discussed the opportunity to have Zach expand to manage media and oversee the website completion and launch. A recommendation was put together by Pastor Stephen and will be presented to Council (see above).

Finance Committee – Kathy Sinclair questioned if we need monthly stewardship letters or if quarterly is enough. Several commented that it is good to receive positive mail from the church more often and the letters are enjoyed. Many offered to help process the monthly letters. It is hoped these letters are an effect of our offerings increasing.

Marketing Committee - We have two new tablecloths for use at events with FLC logo. Awaiting VBS information. Baylee was asked to gather a VBS subcommittee. Property Committee – Discussion on playground. No go-aheads have been given by council, however Trust has approve a grant request. Motion by Steve Slocum and 2nd by Phyllis Stokke to squash any playground planning at this time. Motion passed with one ‘nay’ Travis shared a thought that FLC could possibly engage a property management company to handle the pre-school area matters, and not have Evan taxed with services for preschool needs. No action requested or taken.

OLD BUSINESS –

- 11a Preschool lease letter was reviewed by council. Travis will see that Jody receives it in the next day or two. Goal is to have discussion and resolution by end of May.
- 11b Installation. Don and Kim Daniel will help with the reception Special Guests will be Pastor Stephen’s parents, brother and family, Tera Kossow from Synod.
- 11c Matching Funds – April and May are Trust Grant match for offering.
- 11d Bible Camp/VBS – Youth has the bible camp contract for VBS. We will be asked to host 3 female counselors in town, and more volunteers will be needed to assist during VBS, just as before.

NEW BUSINESS

- 12a New Members – We have 3 new members through baptism, one returned member, and one new member request.
- 12b Sunday Service Groups – Kathy feels we should have greeters and ushers on duty after worship as well as before. Steve initiated discussion on helping relieve the volunteer pressure from Beckie weekly. Prior plans were discussed, and well as youth take-over Sundays. A small group will be formed and bring back ideas. Included in the group will be Steve Slocum and Travis Feiring.
- 12c Confirmands - six confirmands were accepted as members by motion of Steve Slocum and second of Baylee Hanson.

Consent agenda. Motion by Beverly Conway, 2nd by Baylee Hanson to approve the consent agenda and all items and reports offered without motions made previously. Motion passed.

The meeting closed with prayer for congregation members and Blessing.

June Exec Committee meeting will be May 26, 2026 @ 5:00 p.m..

June Council meeting will be June 9, 2026 @ 6 p.m.

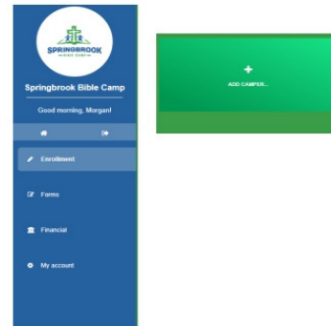


SETTING UP AN ACCOUNT:

2. Select the "Enrollment Tab" to add a camper!

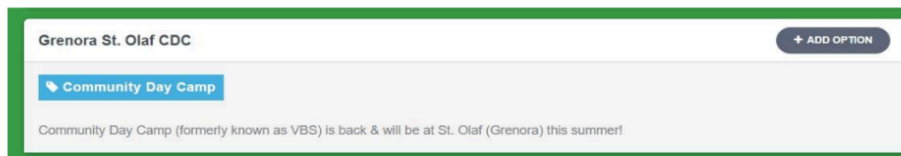
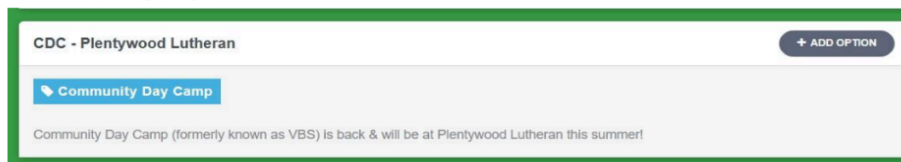
3. Select the green "ADD CAMPER" & complete information for the child you would like to send to CDC!

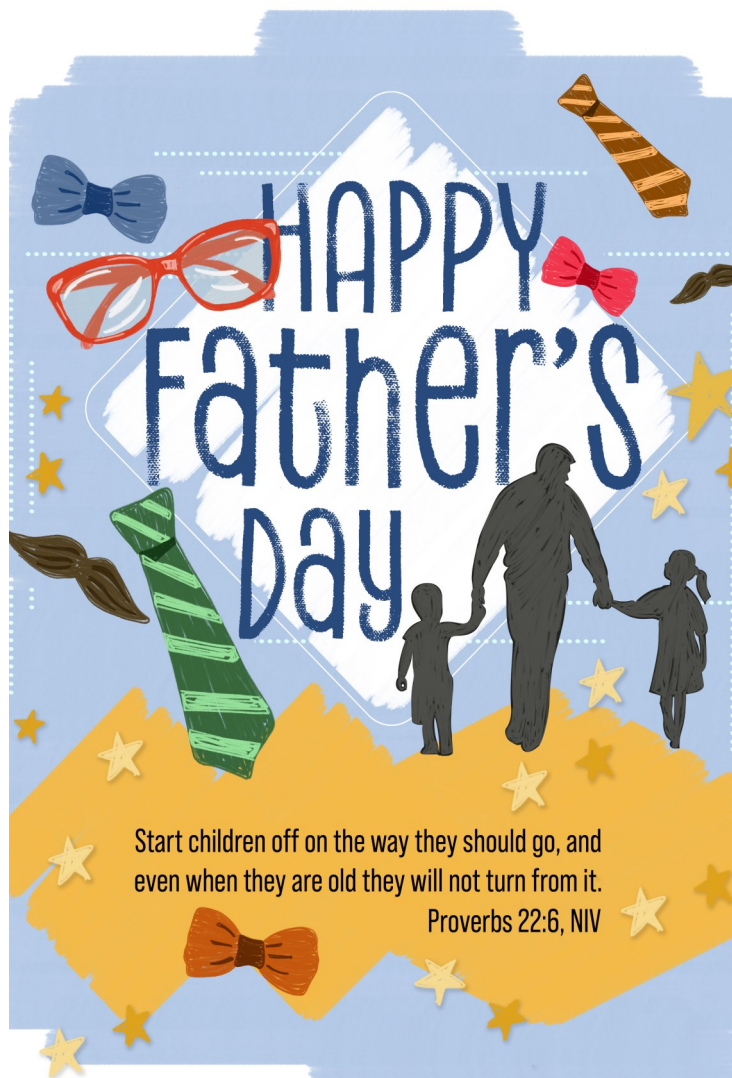
Memorial Donations

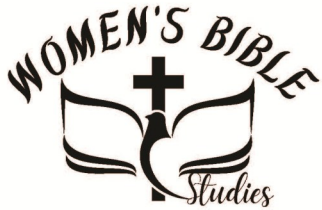
